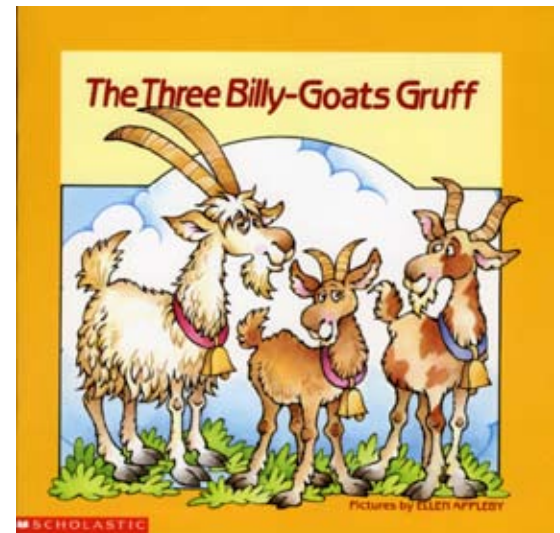


The Three Billy Goats Gruff by Ellen Appleby

After you read this story, consider how different it would be if told from the troll's point of view.

In the Three Billy Goats Gruff episode of SuperWHY, the troll gets to tell his side of the story. According to the troll, those billy goats are just RUDE! Use this story to start a conversation about manners. Then use one of the activities below to reinforce good manners at your house.

- Practice good manners at a make-believe tea party.
- Praise your child for using good manners in public (waiting patiently in line, letting someone else go first or remembering to say please and thank you).
- Talk about other people's behavior. When you see someone using good manners, point it out to your child. Use the people in your family and household as frequent examples.
- Help your child write a thank you note to someone who has done something nice for your family.
