Let's face it. We all make mistakes. If we never made mistakes it would be difficult to learn or grow or change. In the Goldilocks and the Three Bears episode of Superwhy, Whyatt accidentally messes up his brother's room and gets into big trouble.

Talk to your child about what happens in this story.

- Let your child know that it is okay to make mistakes.
- Help your child identify positive solutions to Whyatt (and Goldilocks') problem.
- Ask your child what Goldilocks and Whyatt can learn from their experiences?

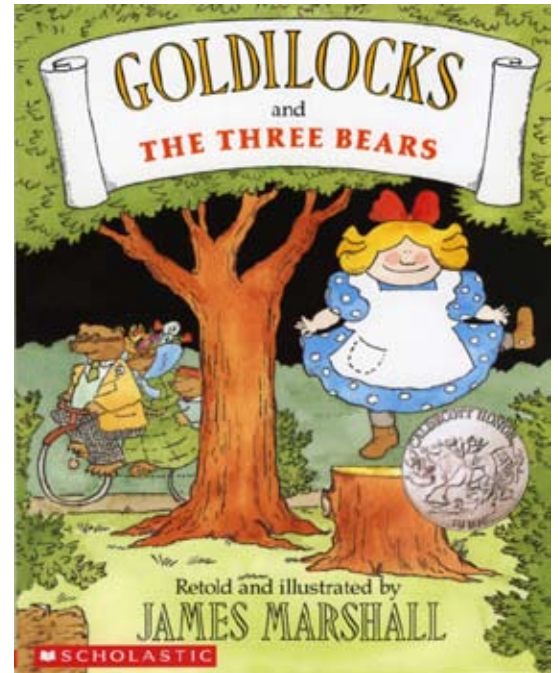
